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# **Abbotsleigh**

40-bar jig (in 10-bar phrases) for three couples in a four-couple longwise set Suggested recorded music: The Wee Cooper of Fife played by Deirdre Adamson

#### **Bars**

- 1-10 1<sup>st</sup> man and 2<sup>nd</sup> man, giving left hands, and 1<sup>st</sup> woman and 2<sup>nd</sup> woman, giving right hands, turn halfway to change places. 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance set and link. Half reels of three across the dance, 1<sup>st</sup> man giving right shoulder to 3<sup>rd</sup> man and 1<sup>st</sup> woman giving right shoulder to 2<sup>nd</sup> woman, and 1<sup>st</sup> couple dancing to second place on the opposite side. Finish in the order 312 on the opposite side.
- 11-20 1<sup>st</sup> couple lead down with left hands for 4 steps. 1<sup>st</sup> man (dancing down) turns his partner under his left arm and 1<sup>st</sup> couple lead up to the top of the set and face out. 3<sup>rd</sup> couple step down on bars 19-20.
- 21-30 1<sup>st</sup> man and 3<sup>rd</sup> woman, giving left hands, and 1<sup>st</sup> woman and 3<sup>rd</sup> man giving right hands, turn halfway to change places. 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> couples dance a half mirror reel on the sides (1<sup>st</sup> couple dance in and down to begin). All set to partner, then 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples cross left hands as 1<sup>st</sup> couple turn left hand to face 4<sup>th</sup> corner position.
- 31-40 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance Hello & Goodbye setting for 6 steps to second place on opposite side. 1<sup>st</sup> couple birl for 4 steps. At the end of the first time, 1<sup>st</sup> couple finish in the centre in second place nearer hands joined facing up. At the end of the second time, 1<sup>st</sup> couple finish in the centre in third place nearer hands joined and they dance bars 1-2, half turning the couple below them to finish in fourth place as the new couple begins.

Repeat having passed a couple.

The aim was to create a dance which gave the lead pair lots of opportunity for covering and synchronisation, culminating in the final birl at the end of "Hello-Goodbye" setting. J Johnston's dances in Minicrib provided the seed crystals from which this dance was developed, and my delight in them, the inspiration.

# Tapadh leibh

32-bar strathspey for three couples in a three-couple longwise set

Bars <b>1-4</b>	1 <sup>st</sup> couple set and cast to second place. 2 <sup>nd</sup> couple step up on bars 3-4.
5-8	$1^{\rm st}$ couple giving right hands to $1^{\rm st}$ corners, turn once round to finish back-to-back facing $1^{\rm st}$ corners.
9-12	$1^{\rm st}$ couple and $1^{\rm st}$ corners dance a half reel of 4. $1^{\rm st}$ couple pass left shoulder to face $2^{\rm nd}$ corners.
13-16	1 <sup>st</sup> couple and 2 <sup>nd</sup> corners dance a half reel of 4. 1 <sup>st</sup> couple give left hands to turn three-quarters in the centre of the dance.
17-20	$1^{st}$ woman dances right hands across with $3^{rd}$ couple while $1^{st}$ man dances right hands across with $2^{nd}$ couple. $1^{st}$ couple finish left shoulder to left shoulder in the centre of the dance.
21-24	1 <sup>st</sup> couple petronella out to the side lines in second place on opposite sides. All couples give nearer hands on the sides and set.
25-28	All couples giving right hand to their partners, turn halfway to finish closely together facing them in the centre of the dance, then pull back their right shoulders and curve out to own sides.
29-32	1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> couples dance right hands across once round.
	Repeat twice from new positions.

This dance is dedicated to all those who helped the devisor when studying for his certificate. There were many stooges who gave so freely of their time over several weeks and other volunteers who made sure there was always enough tea and coffee (and the occasional cake). Special thanks go to our musicians Keith Anderson and Judith Muir and our teacher Mervyn Short. 'Tapadh leibh' (pronounced tapah leyv) means thank you in Scottish Gaelic.

#### The Union of the Crowns Reel

32-bar reel for three couples in a four-couple longwise set

#### Bars

- 1-8 1<sup>st</sup> couple set, then giving right hands turn halfway round to face down, changing to nearer hands dance down to below 3<sup>rd</sup> couple and cast up into second place on the opposite side. 2<sup>nd</sup> couple step up on bars 5-6.
- 9–16 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance reels of three on the side-lines. To begin 1<sup>st</sup> man and 2<sup>nd</sup> woman pass right shoulder and 1<sup>st</sup> woman and 2<sup>nd</sup> man pass left shoulder. 1<sup>st</sup> couple finish in second place on the opposite side. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance the long turn into place at the end of the reel.
- 17–20 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance a petronella turn to finish 1<sup>st</sup> man between 2<sup>nd</sup> couple facing down and 1<sup>st</sup> woman between 3<sup>rd</sup> couple facing up, and 1<sup>st</sup> couple set to each other.
- 21–24 1<sup>st</sup> couple, giving right hand, change places and cast to second place on own sides, 1<sup>st</sup> man right shoulder round 3<sup>rd</sup> man and 1<sup>st</sup> woman right shoulder round 2<sup>nd</sup> woman.
- **25–32** 2nd, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance six hands round and back.

Repeat having passed a couple.

The Union of the Crowns (March 1603) was the accession of James VI, King of Scots, to the thrones of England and Ireland, and the consequential unification of Scotland with both realms under a single monarch.

#### **Lochcarron Loom**

32-bar jig for four couples in a four-couple longwise set

#### **Bars**

- 1-8 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance down (nearer hands joined) for 4 bars. On bar 5, 1<sup>st</sup> woman dances under her partner's arm (1<sup>st</sup> man dances below his partner) and 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance up to second place and face out (2<sup>nd</sup> couple step up on bars 5-6).
- 9-12 1<sup>st</sup> couple cast to third place (3<sup>rd</sup> couple step up on bars 9-10) and cross giving right hands, facing out in third place on their own side of the dance while 2<sup>nd</sup> couple dance down (nearer hands joined) for 4 bars 2<sup>nd</sup> couple pass beyond third place before 1<sup>st</sup> couple cross.
- 13–16 1<sup>st</sup> couple cast behind 4<sup>th</sup> couple and lead up (following 2<sup>nd</sup> couple), with left hands joined, almost to second place but stay in the centre of the dance facing up while 2<sup>nd</sup> woman dances under her partner's arm (2<sup>nd</sup> man dances below his partner) and 2<sup>nd</sup> couple dance up to second place and face out (3<sup>rd</sup> couple step up to first place on bars 13-14). [Bars 9-16 for 2<sup>nd</sup> couple are the same as bars 1-8 for 1<sup>st</sup> couple].
- 17-24 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance a double figure of eight with 3<sup>rd</sup> couple, 1<sup>st</sup> man passing his partner in front of him to begin and 3<sup>rd</sup> couple casting to second place to begin. At the end of the figure 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance in to take nearer hands facing down in the middle in second place, and 3<sup>rd</sup> couple finish in first place facing out while 2<sup>rd</sup> couple cast to third place (4<sup>th</sup> couple do not step up), cross giving right hands, cast below 4<sup>th</sup> couple and dance up with nearer hands joined as far as third place, staying in the middle facing up. [Bars 17-24 for 2<sup>rd</sup> couple are almost the same as bars 9-16 for 1<sup>st</sup> couple].
- 25-32 3<sup>rd</sup> couple cast down as 4<sup>th</sup> couple cast up while 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance under an arch made by 2<sup>nd</sup> couple; all turn for 4 bars 1<sup>st</sup> man & 4<sup>th</sup> man and 2<sup>nd</sup> woman & 3<sup>rd</sup> woman turn one-and-a-quarter times with right hands, and 1<sup>st</sup> woman & 4<sup>th</sup> woman and 2<sup>nd</sup> man & 3<sup>rd</sup> man turn one-and-a-quarter times with left hands to finish on the sides in the order 2341; all set facing partners on bars 31-32.

Repeat 3 more times

Lochcarron Loom is devised to depict the weaving of tartan cloth.

# The Golden Annings

40-bar strathspey for three couples in a three-couple longwise set

#### Bars

- 1-8 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance reflection reels with 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples, 1<sup>st</sup> couple dancing in and down to start, giving hands where possible. 1<sup>st</sup> couple finish in the centre in top place with nearer hands joined facing down. 3<sup>rd</sup> couple finish in the centre in third place with nearer hands joined facing up.
- **9-12** 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples set and link while 2<sup>nd</sup> couple cross giving right hands and set.
- **13-16** Facing clockwise, all chase half way round the set to finish as at the end of bar 8 with 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples having changed places.
- 17-24 Repeat bars 9-16 to finish as at the end of bar 8.
- **25-28** All set, all advance to form a circle, joining hands on bar 28.
- **29-32** 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples drop partners' hands as all retire to own sidelines and set.
- 33-36 1<sup>st</sup> woman changes places with 2<sup>nd</sup> woman giving left hands and then with 3<sup>rd</sup> woman giving right hands while 1<sup>st</sup> man changes places with 2<sup>nd</sup> man giving right hands and then with 3<sup>rd</sup> man giving left hands.
- **37-40** All 3 couples turn with both hands. Finish 2,3,1

Repeat from new places.

# **Triggs Lock**

40-bar reel for three couples in a four-couple longwise set

#### Bars

- **1-4** Taking nearer hands on the sides, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples set and cross right hand. 1<sup>s</sup> couple finish facing out on the opposite side.
- 5-8 1<sup>st</sup> couple cast to second place as 2<sup>nd</sup> couple step up on bars 5-6, then 1<sup>st</sup> couple turn by the right hand to face out on the opposite side in second place.
- **9-16** 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance 'chaperoned chain progression': *Bars Description* 
  - 9-10 1<sup>st</sup> couple cast to their right and dance clockwise a quarter of the way around the set while 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples, giving right hands, turn partners three-quarters to end in a line in the centre of the set.
  - 11-14 3<sup>rd</sup> man and 2<sup>nd</sup> woman, giving left hands, turn in the centre one and a half times to change places while 1<sup>st</sup> woman with 2<sup>nd</sup> man and 1<sup>st</sup> man with 3<sup>rd</sup> woman, taking promenade hold, dance halfway round the set clockwise to change ends. Note that 1<sup>s</sup> woman is on the left of 2<sup>nd</sup> man.
  - 15-16 Releasing hands, 1<sup>st</sup> couple continue to dance clockwise around the set to second place on opposite sides while 3<sup>rd</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> couples, giving right hands, turn three-quarters to opposite sides. 3<sup>rd</sup> couple finish in second place, 2<sup>nd</sup> couple finish in third place. 1<sup>st</sup> couple finish right hand in right hand in the centre, 1<sup>st</sup> man taking left hand with 2<sup>nd</sup> man and 1<sup>st</sup> woman taking left hand with 3<sup>rd</sup> woman to form a diagonal line.
- **17-24** 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance a spoke, moving clockwise and retaining right hands throughout:

Bars Description

- 17-18 1<sup>st</sup> couple with 3<sup>rd</sup> woman and 2<sup>nd</sup> man balance in line then move on clockwise to next corners.
- 19-20 1<sup>st</sup> couple with 3<sup>rd</sup> man and 2<sup>nd</sup> woman balance in line then move on clockwise to next corners
- 21-22 1<sup>st</sup> couple with 3<sup>rd</sup> woman and 2<sup>nd</sup> man balance in line then move on clockwise to next corners.
- 23-24 1<sup>st</sup> couple with 3<sup>rd</sup> man and 2<sup>nd</sup> woman balance in line then move clockwise to second place on opposite side, ending with 1<sup>st</sup> man facing down and 1<sup>st</sup> woman facing up. All three couples set for all eight bars. The corners set facing diagonally across the set when
- hands are not joined to form a diagonal line.
- **25-32** 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> couples dance reels of three on the side. To begin, 1<sup>st</sup> woman gives left shoulder to 3<sup>rd</sup> woman and 1<sup>st</sup> man gives left shoulder to 2<sup>nd</sup> man. 1<sup>st</sup> couple finish in second place on opposite side.
- **33-40** 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> couples dance set and link twice (to finish in the order 2,1,3, all on own sides).

Repeat, having passed a couple.

The dance was inspired following a relaxing stroll along the Wey Navigation in the area of Triggs Lock, which is near Send in Surrey. The dance brings 'chaperoned chain progression' (Tim Wilson) into reel time, while also including several well-known standard figures.

#### **Ambidextrous**

32-bar jig for three couples in a four-couple longwise set

#### Bars

- 1-6 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> couples dance three quarters of a double figure of eight. To begin, 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance down the sides as 2<sup>nd</sup> couple cross up.
- 7-8 2<sup>nd</sup> couple set. At the same time 1<sup>st</sup> couple, giving left hands, turn three quarters to finish back to back in the middle of the set, 1<sup>st</sup> woman facing up and 1<sup>st</sup> man facing down.
- 9-16 1st couple dance double triangles up and down the set with 2nd and 3rd couples. On bars 11-12, 2nd and 3rd men, and 2nd and 3rd women, giving right hands, change places on the sides. On bars 15-16, 1st couple dance petronella turns to finish in second place on opposite sides.
- 17-20 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance half rights and lefts on the diagonal. To begin, 1<sup>st</sup> man gives right hand to 3<sup>rd</sup> man (in first place) and 1<sup>st</sup> woman gives right hand to 2<sup>nd</sup> woman (in third place).
- 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance half rights and lefts on the diagonal. To begin, 1<sup>st</sup> man gives right hand to 3<sup>rd</sup> woman and 1<sup>st</sup> woman gives right hand to 2<sup>nd</sup> man. Finish in order 2,1,3, all on opposite sides.
- 25-32 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance six hands round and back.

Repeat, having passed a couple, with genders temporarily re-assigned\*. As each couple begin their second turn of the dance, on bars 5-8 the new 3<sup>rd</sup> couple, and also the standing couple at the top of the set, giving right hands to partners, change places and set.

\*Note: on bars 1-6 of the repeat, the original men (now dancing as women) should cross in front of their partners.

Dedicated to all those ladies who frequently have to dance as men.

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#### **ALISTER MACLEAY**

32-bar strathspey for four couples in a four-couple longwise set

Two chords. On the second chord 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> couples change places with partners.

#### Bars

- **1-4** All dance eight hands half way round to the left.
- 5-8 All joining hands on the side, set and cross over giving right hands to partners.
- **9-12** Repeat bars 1-4.
- All joining hands on the sides, set and cross over giving right hands to partners, finishing in allemande hold, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> couples facing up, and 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> couples facing down.
- 17-24 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> couples (beginning by dancing upwards) and 4<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples (beginning by dancing downwards), dance interlocking allemandes. On bars 19-20, 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> couples dance past each other on the sides, then complete the allemandes, so that the finishing order is 2,4,1,3 with 4<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples on opposite sides.
- **25-28** 4<sup>th</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> couples dance right hands across.
- **29-32** 4<sup>th</sup> couple dance a half figure of eight around 2<sup>nd</sup> couple, while 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance a half figure of eight around 3<sup>rd</sup> couple.

The finishing order is 2,4,1,3, with 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples on opposite sides.

Repeat three times from new positions each time.

#### THE CAMERON HIGHLANDERS

32-bar reel for three couples in a four-couple longwise set Suggested music: The Cameron Highlanders by J. Scott Skinner

#### Bars

- 1-8 1<sup>st</sup> couple, giving right hands, turn and cast off one place, 2<sup>nd</sup> couple stepping up. 1<sup>st</sup> couple, giving right hands, turn three-quarters, then 1<sup>st</sup> woman turns 2<sup>nd</sup> man with left hand to finish facing down in second place on the opposite side while 1<sup>st</sup> man turns 3<sup>rd</sup> woman with left hand to finish facing up in second place on the opposite side.
- 9-12 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance half reels of three on the opposite sides, 1<sup>st</sup> woman giving right shoulder to 3<sup>rd</sup> man to begin, 1<sup>st</sup> man giving right shoulder to 2<sup>nd</sup> woman to begin.
- 13-16 1<sup>st</sup> man dances a half reel of three across with 3<sup>rd</sup> couple in top place, giving left shoulder to 3<sup>rd</sup> man to begin while 1<sup>st</sup> woman dances a half reel of three across with 2<sup>nd</sup> couple in third place, giving left shoulder to 2<sup>nd</sup> woman to begin. 1<sup>st</sup> couple finish back to back facing their partners' 2nd corner positions.
- 17-20 1<sup>st</sup> couple dance round their partners' 2nd corner positions and cast to second place own side while 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance right hands across for 2 bars, stay in the centre facing in, pull right shoulder back and dance out to opposite corners.
- **21-24** 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples, giving right hands, turn once round.
- **25-32** 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> couples dance six hands round and back.
